The European Commission has pointed out that: "Fighting high levels of unemployment - particularly among young people - is one of the most urgent tasks for European governments. Too many young people leave school prematurely running a high risk of being unemployed and socially marginalised".

TEAMSS - Together Europe Achieves More in School Success - is the title of our project.We feel this title clearly represents our goals for this project to achieve and improve the school results and to avoid drop outs that may lead to unemployment with young people.We are of the opinion that methods like sharing methods, common teaching and learning, collaboration among students and teaching staff will be benefitted by students first of all and will lead to a better and more prosperous future to our young people.

Our project is based on achieving better school outcomes . We aim to train our students to a variety of relevant skills that will enable them to work successfully, think creatively and be confident enough for the challenges of the 21st century. We especially will focus on Foreign Language , Mother Tongue and Natural sciences and Mathematics as well as social competences. As mentioned before students are aged between 12 and 16/17 years.

According to the number of students` and teachers`mobilities applied for we hope to work with over 70 students and about 40 teachers directly during LTT actions, aquired knowledge for potential longer term benefits should be multiplied and disseminated/shared with colleagues in the designated school departments and of course, among the students` peer groups .

Activities to be carried out are 7-day mobilities (C1-C6) to collaborate face-to-face in mixed international groups in different countries on assignments decided on before. Activities between mobilities are described as P1-P6 and are assignments to do and being evaluatedfor the the previous and prepare the future meeting.

One of the most important elements of this project proposal is the effort to combine expertise with education. We have planned to ask stakeholders or other highly skilled professionals as e.g. the German IQB (Institute for Quality Development in Education) or teachers` training seminar (Lehrerseminar Gera) to formally participate in our project in order to analyse not only German, but as well Italian, Portuguese, Polish or Romanian students by official competence tests. Conclusions will be drawn out of the results of those placement tests .Teachers will discuss, compare and adapt their methods to enhance students` scores and students will be enabled to work in national and transnational teams to apply new knowledge to reach higher academic success and put these skills in practical use.



Therefore a first analysis of results achieved in three key competences (Mother Tongue, Foreign Language--> English and Mathematics) at school level and European level is indispensable. This process will have 3 different moments to diagnose the results: the beginning of the school year 2019 and compare them with the end of the first school year (2020 - second momen)t, and the end of the second school year (2021 - third moment). This way there will be some time to plan the work and monitor, adapt or adjust the work, concerning the school competences .

Our team consists of five partners: Germany (coordinator), Portugal, Poland, Italy, and Romania. All of us have collaborated very successfully in the past on an Erasmus+ project, this strong relationship that we hold to this day will benefit us greatly in a new project. Our common experience will lead into another successful activities: nation-based competence tests and their assessments on an European level, creation of relevant workshops, presentations, management of international student exchanages and activities, competitions (e.g. academic decathlons on intermediate level) excursions and cultural activities.

Philip Rosenthal, (23 October 1916 – 27 September 2001), a German industrialist said once: "Wer aufhört, besser zu werden, hat aufgehört, gut zu sein" which can be translated into English "If you stop getting better, you stop being good." This is what we want our students be sensitized for. Open minds, responsibility, personal education considered valuable, creativity, positive attitudes and abilities to collaborate are requirements European students have to meet for developing, working and living successfully.

Our secondary school is situated in Zeulenroda-Triebes which lies in the south east of the federal state of Thuringia. It is known as the green heart of Germany. Cities as Dresden, Leipzig can easily be reached by train in a two-hour distance. The staff (26) teaches 336 students at the ages of 10 to 16 years in forms 5-10 (secondary level I). In 2018 we eternally were granted with the title/label "European School" that is awarded to Thuringian schools with a special, Europe-oriented profile extra- and intercurricularly. The school offers a wide range of academic subjects fixed in the state curriculum, extra-curricular and further more tutoring activities to fight insufficient results and achievements especially in German, English and Mathematics with students that are socially, cognitively or physically challenged. Key people in charge of running the project in our school therefore are the members of the Foreign languages Dept., Mother tongue (German) Dept. and Sciences/Mathematics Dept. Responsibilities are shared and so taking over another teachers assignments /tasks does not display any problem. To prepare our students for their future professional lives annual practical trainings in local companies with international connections are a compulsory part of the school curriculum for students in forms 7-10. English and Russian are offered as first or second foreign languages and to underline the importance of acquiring them we have successfully involved in several international cooperation projects (Comenius, LLL, Erasmus+) since 1998.Italian as an additional language is offered as after-school activity. Bedded in a charming landscape with natural and storage lakes and hilly countryside little guesthouses and hotels host tourists from our and foreign countries. Therefore both students and their parents and teaching staff are eager to be an active, responsible and reliable part of this international Erasmus+Project. According to the motivation there are two main objectives we are focusing on. First: the project will improve learning results in mother tongue, Mathematics and the first foreign language - English. Second: the multilateral collaboration of institutions in Europe has always been a valuable and successful part of our inter- and extra curricular activities so far. The implementation of knowledge about Europe like teaching methods, schoolsystems, cultural diversities, history, traditions and social life which surround, separate and unite us by different learning methods, by producing and disseminating audiovisual, print or virtual materials and by conventions and international students`exchanges cannot be rated highly enough.

Anadia Group of Schools (AEAnadia) offers a diverse educational network, from kindergarten, primary, junior, secondary and adult education. Its aims are to promote equity, social inclusion and citizenship among our students/learners; quality and efficiency in education training; invest in skills and training to foster employability, ensuring the sustainability of our social models; develop innovation, creativity; entrepreneurship; develop long life mobility projects in order to achieve success, fight against social exclusion, early drop outs, and unemployment. In terms of educational and training offer it branches out into two different programmes: one higher education-oriented general secondary courses such as Scientific-Humanistic Courses (Sciences and Technologies, Visual Arts, Socioeconomic Sciences and Languages and Humanities) and the other more workoriented - professional courses in the areas of Tourism, Sports, Social Cultural Animation, Industrial Maintenance - Mechatronics and Management and Programming of Computer Systems. In addition there are Education and Training Courses (CEF-Type 2) in the areas of Restaurant / Bar and Mechanical Locksmith, the Qualification Center, Adult Education, Training and Certification of Competencies. Anadia has a vivid youth community, and our school has the aim of raising the awareness in this youth community about European policies and, at the same time, to boost the cooperation with the public authorities. The board of teachers would like to implement several learning circles to foster critical thinking and empowerment of our citizens. Key persons of the project: coordinator of the European projects, with a long experience in projects, a group of teachers of English that have also taken part in different projects, including e-twinning, and former European projects coordinator, directors of classes responsible for selecting a group of students to take part in the activities and also in the mobilities and the SPO (Psychology and Orientation) office to prepare and support the students in the European work. As we are a big school there are a big number of teachers' trainers that can prepare specific workshops and training sessions for both teachers and students, and together with the training Centre of Agueda certificate those training sessions.

Our school Institute "Vincenzo Mennella" is in the South of Italy with almost 600 students attending the Infant, Primary and Lower Secondary school. The teachers and staff are 80 with experiences in documentation, assessment and inclusion. The school is on the Ischia island, far from towns and cities of cultural interest. It is not in a disadvantaged area in terms of socio-economic, but it is affected by the deficiencies of cultural stimuli alternative to institutional. It is in a natural environment rich in nature and history that help to develop an educative teaching for proper integration schoolenvironment. In this area there has long been a transformation of the local culture, changing from a typically peasant and seafaring tradition to a touristic culture. Consequently our school Institute is the main educational agency of the territory and has the task to provide adequate support to the students so that they can go on taking an active part in the learning process and prevent their school failure and drop outs. The presence of more and more students from other cultures offers opportunities for enrichment through comparison between cultures but on the other hand requires a specific commitment to the school to meet the needs of linguistic integration of these students, integration culture of their families and to promote a "school for everybody". The school Institute educates everybody on the cognitive and cultural level to: 1) enable them to deal positively with the uncertainty and mutability of social and employment scenarios; 2) enhance the personal inclinations in all its peculiarities, principally based on various forms of diversity and/or disadvantages and its link to the area in which the students live; 3) create the conditions ensuring every individual the right to education and training that lead to fully realize their potential and grow capacity as European citizens; 4) decrease school failure always keeping in mind the principle of "lifelong learning". In the past our school participated in European projects with relevant targets and analysis of the needs of the partner schools countries' areas and on issues concerning European school systems and changes in education. Teachers and the local authorities have carried out studies on the local school drop outs, on school systems and on local economy (European projects "NETS in Europe", 2003-2006; Entrepreneurship:imagination@work, 2017-2019). Teachers, school staff with skills and competences in assessment, inclusion, support on families' needs, in mathematics, ICT, foreign languages will take part in this Erasmus+ project. The school departements of "Documentation and Assessment" and "Inclusion" will help teachers and staff to achieve the planned goals. In particular the above mentioned departments alreav experienced the comparison and analysis oft he different results coming from specific activities and methods of social inclusion focused on avoiding drop outs.

The "Mihai Eminescu" College of Bacău comprises two levels of education: general secondary and postsecondary. The postsecondary level is a VET adult level that trains future nurses for three years. The present project is aimed at the general secondary level that encompasses 582 students, from 14 to 19 years old. The specializations in our school are: natural sciences, computer programming, social sciences and philology. Around 30% of the students come from the surrounding villages. Due to the proximity to the main railway station, our institution has a boarding school that houses 110 students. Many of our students are in financial difficulties or their parents are working abroad. The school also hosts 20 students from the Republic of Moldova who study here on a grant from the Romanian government. Judging by their results at the national examinations, our students are medium achievers. Over the past 5 years, the pass rate at the national baccalaureate exam varied from 85% to 95%, which is above national average. But the school aims at developing the students to their top potential so as to foster their subsequent professional and social integration. From a curricular point of view, in order to help them get better results at the national examinations, the teachers spend extra time each week in order to help the students better understand the subjectspecific issues. The school also has a wide offer of elective courses that match the students' needs and interests in order to facilitate their creativity and autonomy. The school keeps a close relationship with the students' parents, in order to prevent any mishap that might affect the students' performance. The school welcomes this European cooperation on the topic of improving school results, as a way of raising the school's performance as a whole and attractivity at local level, as well. At the end of the first semester (the end of January), the school recorded 6 students who had to withdraw from school for various reasons, some health-related and others becauseof financial difficulties. Therefore, this project is important to us for two main reasons. On the one hand, any student who is not going to school puts himself/herself at risk of exclusion, and is a possible future liability for society at large. On the other, the school receives funding for each student enrolled, and losing students means losing funding from the state budget. The teachers are highly trained at local, national and European level. In the framework of the previous LLP, the school's teachers took part in various training courses, on various topics, organised within the following sub-programmes: Comenius, Grundtvig, Youth in Action, the transversal programme and Pestalozzi. Regarding our experience, the previous Comenius multilateral partnership (2011-2013) dealt with innovative pedagogical approaches in the field of reading techniques and methods of encouraging reading among the studentss in the partner countries.

Through competence tests we have identified common weaknesses in the different schools connected with the school results in selected key competences :

-Foreign Language (for all participants: English)

-Mother Tongue

-Mathematics/Sciences

We already experienced and have the fear to experience furthermore drop outs of students that definitely decreases chances on the regional/national labour market. The European Commission has pointed out that: "Fighting high levels of unemployment - particularly among young people - is one of the most urgent tasks for European governments. Too many young people leave school prematurely running a high risk of being unemployed and socially marginalised".

This is a European problem detected by the partner schools and we want to broaden the minds of our students at a European level and the only possibility is to take them abroad to the different schools.

European projects have become a valuable part of our school lives and more and more students and teachers are looking forward to sharing and exchanging good practices on the international level. Such a cooperation greatly contributes to fighting with prejudices, harmful stereotypes and helps to build bridges and tighten bonds between EU members which we consider . Furthermore improvements in oral and written language skills are being monitored with those projects. Therefore we would like to join this project to share and exchange, and thus improve our skills as well as broaden our minds.Good results means motivation for the students.

In bilateral exchanges with other/different partners we experienced that students like travelling to other countries, they enjoyed having been acommodated in host families as well as the experience of a different school system, social life and culture . Students returned back home with knowledge that cannot be found in textbooks , wonderful memories of their exchange or a newly-generated and long-lasting friendship.

We know that Erasmus+ is not a pure school exchange. We appreciate the chances to create exchange and learning activities, to cooperate and collaborate transnationally especially for students in different surroundings and countries and to cooperate with stakeholders. Research shows that better (learning) results can be achieved in a pleasant environment and teamwork as well as with partners that support learners with external knowledge, however.



What are the objectives you would like to achieve and concrete results you would like to produce? How are these objectives linked to the priorities you have selected?

The objectives "supporting individuals in acquiring and developing basic skills and key competences" should have an impact on students to improve school results and to avoid drop outs. We will compare the school results in two levels: school level and European level. This process will have 3 different moments to diagnose the results: the beginning of the school year 2019 and compare them with the end of the first school year (2020 - second moment), and the end of the second school year (2021 - third moment).

First of all we aim to train our students to a variety of relevant skills that will enable them to work successfully, think creatively and be confident enough for the challenges of the 21st century.

These objectives linked to the selected priorities directly refer to

1-EU Citizenship, EU awareness and Democracy

2-Pedagogy and didactics

3-Quality Improvement Institutions and/or methods (incl. school development) as examplarily mentioned in the project description above.

Concrete results we expect are countable and visible achievements in the three key competences mentioned above. We can assess those achievements with the help of professionally generated placement tests with the help of a possible future German stakeholder, the IQB (Institute for Quality Development in Education, Berlin).

This way there will be some time to plan the work and monitor, adapt or adjust assignments concerning the school results, evaluate competence tests regularly and draw conclusions how to modify teaching approaches and methods (Pedagogy and didactics).

Further and positive intellectual side effects and results of this project are expected through LLT mobilities and their impacts on participating students (first) and teachers(second), as they are e.g. -social competences

-general academic competences

-abilities in teamwork

-acquired knowledge about participating schools and school systems in general as well as about countries, social life and traditions to fight prejudices and promote understanding for each other (EU-awareness). Of course those results cannot be measured in grids or charts, but will be visible in improved social skills of our students.

Physical results shall be short videos taken and produced by students, shanties or raps, posters etc., useful learning tips to spread new knowledge, supporting learning materials for student generations to come ,our E-book , web-page , feedbacks to schoolboards or Quality Improvement Institutions and this directly leads to a positive and sustainable school development.



How are the planned activities going to lead to achievement of the project's objectives?

We think we have a well-thought out and clearly defined project with tangible steps, therefore we feel that it is realistic to be able to predict the achievements , as close as possible. Beginning with the most important factor, our students, they have a number of expected outcomes/achievements. The first major outcome should be better results in the national competence tests in Mother Tongue, English and Mathematics. To get to this goal SWOT analysis is used as well as transnational workshops during the LLT meetings. To get to this goal will mean that these transnational teams will have to succeed in successful communication (putting their English into practice), combine their talents and learn to negotiate their positions and, of course, use everything that they can learn from the workshops to lead them to success in establishing better results. Furthermore our teams will learn how to cooperate in teams. More importantly, they will learn how to work together in international teams with a different educational background, cultural setting and language which is quite different than team work carried out with their friends at school.

We expect our students to improve their skills in speaking English, widen their knowledge in the main subjects mentioned above, and make strong connections with our partners that will hopefully lead to more collaboration in the future. They will undoubtedly grown in confidence from the experience of traveling and spending time in other schools. The collaboration with local, regional or national stakeholders that most of us have taken steps to set up already will be a huge value to our students as they will have the opportunity to increase educational results with the help of their analysis or support.

About teachers proposed achievements: Developing ICT tools at a higher level and offering an Etwinning training course to improve the way of using it are necessary for a modern teacher's profile in these days. A physical product to show at the end of this project will be an E-Book as a type of "Competence Manual" that can be used in our schools /in schools generally without restriction to continue teaching the skills learned after the completion of this project ,should we be approved for it.We hope to bring authorities/institutions together with schools. And finally we believe and know from experience that they are so important as they bring a different and cruical element to our education systems. We take the chance to move away from our textbooks and truly create something meaningful and lasting with our students, generating experiences that we can treasure and benefit from for years to come. It probably seems too great of a statement to claim that this project could benefit the European Union; but our team believes that waves start with ripples and our project is a step out from the four walls of our class rooms to a real world. This only can bring us as Europeans together and impact the EU in manifold ,positive ways.

All the five of us have worked together very successfully in a previous Erasmus+ project (Entrepreneurship:Imagination@work):Romania,Italy, Poland, Portugal, Germany.We have decided to collaborate again quite simply because it worked perfectly before, and our schools bring various strengths that complement each other very well.Should we be awarded approval for this project, our variety of qualities would be essential again.The Portuguese school was awarded the European E-Twinning label and they have been working for some time in that platform and would bring an array of technological expertise to the team, which will be of huge importance for this project as we plan an E-Book and a common web-page to communicate and share /disseminate project results. Our Polish partners come from a school with a high academic record. While they know they can contribute so much to this project, they also can benefit to a high degree. They focus on fighting dwindling creativity and gaining more opportunities in teamwork.

Our Italian partners come from the small island of Ischia. In opposite to the economically stronger north of Italy the south struggles for better economical and academical chances for their students and commits clearly to fight common scholastic weaknesses as well as to prepare their students for a future labour market in Italy or abroad. Each partner has got own and general tasks to be fulfilled. Every country will host a LLT-mobility (C1-C6) for 16 stundents and 8 teachers each. (Portugal:2) This means preparation and realization on different levels:

A)Organisation of host families /accomodation/transport/catering etc. for the guests coming. B)Organisation of a balanced program for both students and teachers that realizes all aspects of planned objectives, e.g. common learning experiences, working in transnational groups, attending workshops with specialists ,spending free time together or organizing a cultural day etc.

C)Providing time /possibilities to evaluate and specify objectives that have been reached so far or that have not been reached yet.

D)Out of the evaluation and according to the timetable: generating assignments to be worked on between the mobilities (= P1-P6) is necessary.

E)Concerning the activities P1-P6 all partners will work according to the schedule and its fixed assignments.

That means during the P-activities each partner will be responsible for their own students and fulfilling national assignments (= homework) first of all. This, however, does not exclude exchange of information transnationally.

E-book, school web-sites, local press and media update information or give publicity to ongoing activities and received results, especially during or after ongoing work (P) or transnational LTT (C). A balanced and sufficient communication between all partners will not display any problem. Teachers as well students today are linked perfectly via social networks or the eTwinning platform that allow fast, efficient and easy-going communication. We as teachers have been knowing and working for many years now, using the digital tools as well as meeting personally or having bilateral school exchanges. WE all are experienced in school exchanges and how to plan, prepare, carry out and evalute them. Some of the schools have been working in the same projects together and in the unlike case that teacher-newcomers are not so experienced a special attention will be taken into account and the coordinator or colleagues in general will support them.

Over the years there have been discussions about how to select, prepare and support the participants, and ensure their safety. There are manifold approaches, but we all agreed about priorities:

1-There should be a team leader in each participating institution. He/she should take the primary responsibility for how they manage the projects (including LTT) in their school and locally.

2-If possible each school should have a group of committed students ("Erasmus+ club") who especially may take care for the P1-P6 project assignments and their practical realization.

3-If possible, the leaders should be present at each meeting to keep continuity and stability throughout the project in their schools.

4-For each mobility the team leader will take one colleague with them C1 --> 2 colleagues), selected on their merit and passion about working in the project, and also based on their organizational skills and experience in going on trips with students, coping with rare, but possible problems abroad and offering practical help and support to students if recquired. The team leaders should select their co-workers themselves .

5-The students that participate shall also be chosen on their merit. As it may occur that more students show their interest to be a member of an LTT than actually can be taken abroad, those ones who are most interested in taking part and getting the work done, in communicating in English (on a certain level), and who have proven their capability and trust-worthiness will be selected as chief participants ((e.g.by a students` questionnaire). Judging merit and justifying selection is assessed differently by different schools. For some the most important element was that students at least could communicate at an A2 level (ERF). If lower, students would suffer difficulties to follow lessons, workshops or to work on assignments. Other schools` priorities for example are talents to bring in or passion and interests demonstrated by students.

6-Students/participants who will travel will get a comprehensive briefing/prepared especially with their parents about the LLT: destination, schedule, flight/travelling times, climate , finances, insurances (travel, health), special needs, medication, possibilities of contact, currency , consent to treatment of minor etc.

7-Teams try to fix dates of coming LTT as soon as possible to give organizing teachers the chance to prepare everything as carefully as possible.
